# The UK ASTEROIDS CONTEST



We hope all of you who played in our Asteroids Contest at Olympia enjoyed it as much as we did! We were certainly busy - Atari Owners Club Members of all ages, from all over the country, battled it out - in 15 minute sessions against the clock! Even Dave Lee Travis popped in to lend a bit of encouragement to Members!

Winner was Paul Staines (aged 14) from Wembley, Middx - who scored 86,510. Second came Jimmy Preston (13) of Peckham Rye, SE15 - who scored 84,190. Third was David Boyes (16) who had travelled down from Yorkshire for the day. He lives at Dunnington, York - and scored 83,990.

Current Atari U.K. Overall Champion Stephen Bradley (14), from North Crawley near Milton Keynes, managed to squeeze into the top ten, and Junior Champion Stuart Clarke of 2 Thorndean Street, Earlsfield, SW18 did admirably to be placed fourth - with a score of 82,670.

#### Won U.S. Trip and Gold Medal

As part of his prize, Paul then took an all-expenses-paid trip, courtesy of Ingersoll, to Washington, U.S.A. to play in Atari's International Asteroids

Tournament Final on Saturday 14th

November. He played against the National Contest winners from fifteen other countries, which had all held their own contests, similar to the U.K. one organised by Ingersoll Electronics (25,000 competitors had taken part altogether). Paul won an impressive Asteroids Tournament Gold Medal for his prowess in the U.K. Contest but in the International competition he was placed ninth.

We were thrilled with his enthusiasm, and courage for agreeing to take part in the Washington Tournament: well done Paul, from all of us! And need we tell you - the International Tournament Winner was Andy Breyer (15), from Chicago. He scored 142,910!

#### Games people play — continued

We were talking about Nolan Bushnell in AB17, weren't we! Well, to continue with our potted History — in 1972, Atari was founded — with the successful introduction of 'PONG', the first electronic video game to be offered to the coin-operated amusement industry. Widespread acceptance and popularity of video games followed, and led to Atari's dynamic growth into an innovative, multi-million dollar corporation.

In 1975, the introduction of a home version of 'PONG' pioneered the development of reliable video games, designed to be used with the player's own TV set. Two years later, the Atari Video Computer System (we call it the VCS for short!) was developed. This was the industry's first programmable console unit, utilising Game Programme Cartridges.

The Atari VCS has gone from strength to strength, as we all know. It is now the world's best-selling microprocessor-based TV game — and looks like staying that way in the forseeable future. In parallel to this wildfire development, Atari is continuing with an on-going commitment to creative and technological advancement in three major markets — coin-op amusements, TV-based home entertainment, and home computers.
